LCIP Identity Statement: LCIP is a civic non-profit that reaches goals toward invasive species awareness and control efforts by using Civic Governance (CG) to educate and organize the civic infrastructure needed to govern for the common good.

Meeting Purpose: To discuss needs and progress of the 2020 LCIP work plan, review the financials, and build up the LCIP region's capacity for invasive species education, outreach and control through partnerships.

I. Approval of Outcomes Document from June 25th, 2020 Board Meeting

Outcomes were approved as written by all members.

II. Negotiate agenda and individual check-ins <u>only tied</u> to LCIP Work Plan Goals <u>not listed</u> on the agenda (5 mins each) – identify progress in organizing key stakeholders in your jurisdictions and agreed individual action items.

Dick: had a personal property walk through for his Landmark land trust easement from the LCIP intern (Kyle) where they discovered that all the buckthorn treated last year was dead. Down the road from his land north of Colfax there were 5-6 plants of wild parsnip two years ago, then last year he found a patch that was 2 sq. yds, which this year is now 50 yards long along the road. On Cty BB he found the roadway was full of Wild parsnip. **A game plan needs to be discussed.**

Mame: 4-Control, Inc. did some wild parsnip herbicide trials in her road ditch. She will be to collecting monarda and spiderwort seeds. She took a virtual tour of her sister's property in Iowa that has been transformed from a crop field to a created prairie with the use of government programs with the purpose being to build the soil and to have public access of the 80 acre parcel. She recommended everyone to check it out. Ask her for the link to view it.

Judy: talking to new neighbor about Amur cork trees that lives on Oak Park Circle.

Lauren: is hosting a 10-15 women's kayak forestry event and has invited Chris to present on terrestrial invasives in Clear Lake, WI. She is also contributing to a National Women's Owning Forestry website. Also following up with IMP mentees.

Dave: working with Chris and Kyle in filming some drone videos at Dobb's Landing, the former Ferry Pit in Colfax and Corydon Park in Eau Claire. These videos will be posted in August and September and shared with the management committees.

Brad: lost his 3M intern and is hoping to do some herbicide spraying of spotted knapweed on the 3M Menomonie campus, but that may have to be put on hold.

AJ: looking at area trout streams for aquatic invasives with interns. He is transitioning to new DNR AIS contract with many meetings and reports that have been keeping him busy.

Doug: had a visit with Jim in Barron County, one of his IMP mentees where he is doing buckthorn removal using grazing as a control method. Doug got to observe fringed orchid there.

Chris: has posted 21 videos Kyle had filmed that have been each viewed by up to 9,600 people. This past month LCIP Facebook posts have reached 36,000 people. On site visits, he talked to people about jumping worms, since they have been found in Brookfield, WI, and on Lake Wissota coming from local mulch. He found an orange and yellow parasitic vine that is called dodder on many shorelines. He found some fragrant sumac that smells like skunk and native New Jersey tea crowded by invasive cypress spurge. He has contacted people about taking on the LCIP secretary and

treasury positions, but no interest yet. He gave a presentation to TMLIA about using Civic Governance in their organization. He has helped Kyle with monitoring and mapping. He will be meeting and filming with Asa the Central Wisconsin Invasives Partnership Director on woodland management and CISMAs at Mame's place.

Kyle: been making more videos for LCIP and future educational maps.

III. Address Governing Issues

- 2020 Work Plan mid-point evaluation review

Discussed the benefit is that the work plan can be modified as needed due to changing conditions. It would be nice to get more site visit case studies to add to the LCIP database. Everyone agreed there was amble time to discuss needs and issues. Chris will color code the progress of the work plan and email out to active members before the next meeting to review.

- Invasives Monitoring Program update

Chris went over the current state of IMP program that has 21 volunteers and 11 mentors. Aug. 11th is the date planned for a second advanced online training and he will use Zoom with the expectation that half of the people will be attending. The app has been giving some volunteers issues. Chris showed the items that are the in the packages for each of the IMP volunteers.

- Wild Chervil and Wild Parsnip committee update

The County Highway departments need to build more of a case for their budgets and would like to get maps out again as to where the invasives are located. Chris talked to Dunn County Highway and Chippewa County Highway staff to give more support and background on why controlling invasives in roadsides are so important. He is scheduling a meeting with Eau Claire County Highway department soon. Weather has been an issue this year in herbicide treatments and vigor of plant growth. There is also growing pressure from townships on concerns like wild chervil where they are considering using plant growth regulators and taking into consideration the costs involved. Lee (4-Control, Inc.) will be fabricating specialty equipment for counties so they can do their own spraying. After attending many workshops, most of the counties in the LCIP region are putting out a call to do monitoring for wild chervil and wild parsnip on county and state highway roads. The counties are ready to act and just need more direction/feedback on what is out there. LCIP will do their best to get people trained and map those roads this year and next. Kyle, Kathy, Dick, Dave and Chris all volunteered to help map and drive.

- Report financials, review 2020 LCIP Budget, grant updates, and take any financial requests Kathy gave the report with no comments or suggestions. Chris gave update on the two grants LCIP is administering. The PPP loan has been used up and now must work on forgiveness paperwork.
